

INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTERING YOUR STUDENT

In order to make schedule changes, you must first complete the registration process and pay school fees. Schedules will be available online from August 2 – August 22 on SIS/Aspire. Expect a 72-hour turnaround time after completing registration to be able to access your schedule.

Seniors are encouraged to make individual appointments for their College and Career Ready plan. You can access the online scheduler from the counseling link on the school website.

All counselor assisted class changes will be charged \$10. No schedules will be changed after Friday, August 24, at this time schedules will be final.

PARKING PERMITS

To park on campus, all students who drive a vehicle are required to have a parking permit. Parking permits can be purchased for \$10.00 at the finance office. Students are expected to park in “Student Parking” sections only. Tickets will be issued for parking violations. DRESS CODE

Many students will be shopping for school clothes in the coming weeks. To be clear and avoid misunderstandings regarding the dress code policy, please read the provided school and district dress and grooming standards. Please understand that the school dress policy is in place to help ALL students have a successful and safe school experience.

General Standards

- Draws undue attention, distracts, disrupts, and/or interferes with the educational environment at school or at a school activity or event.
- Endangers the health, safety, or welfare of the student or others.
- May cause damage to school facilities or equipment.

Specific Standards

- Clothing must be neat, clean, and in good repair.
- Clothing must be modest. Modesty includes covering shoulders, midriff, back, underwear, and cleavage. Inappropriately short, tight, or revealing clothing is prohibited.
- Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be at least mid-thigh length when the student is sitting.
- Clothing (and other personal items) shall be free of writing, pictures, or any other insignias that are lewd, obscene, vulgar, or profane; are violent or advocate hate; signify gang affiliation; promote or represent tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or illegal substances; promote or represent criminal or illegal activities; infringe upon the rights of others; or are sexually suggestive.
- Sunglasses are not to be worn in the school building during school hours, except as part of an approved school activity or for medical reasons.
- Appropriate footwear shall be worn at all times. Gang-related clothing is not allowed in schools or at school related activities. This includes, but is not limited to, tattoos, bandanas, chains, clothing, or jewelry associated with gangs.
- All students must maintain their hair in a clean and well-groomed manner.

FEE WAIVERS

You must apply to our school to be granted a fee waiver. To receive a fee waiver, you must meet one of the following guidelines:

- Qualify for free school lunch (reduced lunch does not qualify for fee waivers)
- Receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments
- Receive Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC)
- All students who qualify for a fee waiver will be given the opportunity to work off the cost of their fees. When you meet with an administrator to qualify for the fee waiver you may select the method to be used to earn your fees.

*An administrator will be in the school July 29-30, from 8:00 - 3:00 p.m. to assist those who desire to apply for a fee waiver. Please bring one of the following to qualify:

- A copy of your 2017 Income Tax Return
- Verification of receiving SSI payments
- Verification of receiving AFDC payments
