

### MMHS Eagle HighFLIGHTS: 2-16-16

**\*MMHS Wrestling:** The wrestling team finished their season last week with a 34-2 dual meet record and a second place finish at the State Tournament. We had two state champions. Tanner Cox captured his third state title and Taylor LaMont became the 26th person in the history of the state to win four state championships, his career record was 242 wins and only 9 losses. Korbon Tibbals, Cory Rokovitz, and Brandyn Van Tassell all finished 2nd at state. Spencer Curtis placed third, Quenton Mortimer was fourth, Tristan Hellstrom, Bruce Campbell, Parker Kay and Brad King were all fifth.

**\*MMHS Art Acceptance into State & National Shows:** The following students got their artwork into the State High School Art Show. Our school had 15 entries and 8 that were sent were accepted. There were 979 entries into the show. 328 entries were chosen for the whole state. The show runs from Feb 6, 2016 – March 25, 2016

Cade Dennison was accepted into the National K-12 Ceramics show this year. Out of 1300 entries, 158 were selected. His piece will be sent off and judged in Kansas City, Missouri in March.

**\*MMHS Swimming:** There were no team trophies for Valley 4A and 3A swim teams this season, but local competitors did earn some individual event titles and other medals during the state meets, which concluded Saturday at BYU. <u>This quote is taken from the Deseret News</u>: The Maple Mountain freshman swimmer, Makayla Cazier, began turning heads, landing herself in the middle lane just in time for the 4A state swim meet, which is one of four taking place this weekend at BYU. "She went from the middle of the pack to No. 1 in both the 200 individual medley and 100 backstroke," said Joe Pereira, the president of the Utah Swimming Coaches Association. In the 200 IM, Cazier will line up her qualifying time of 2:11.32 next to Highland junior Zoe Phillips' 2:13.37 and Olympus sophomore Bella White's 2:16.18. Cazier will meet the Highland junior again in

the 100 back, testing her 58:43, the only sub-one-minute qualifier, against Phillips' 4A state record swim of 56.91, which she set a year ago. Congratulations Makayla! Go Eagles!


