- Jacoy led the pledge
- Emily shared a thought and reminder that there is a need in our community to give and donate; it is good for us to remember that there is a need.
- Jeanine shared about the PTSC
  - They are still selling senior swag
  - Start selling candy at basketballs
  - Doing a service project of caroling
- Holly did a report on the school accountability measurements and data overview
- DeAnn reviewed the Trustlands Goal #1
  - Measurements of Growth
    - Student Learning Objectives
      - Develop baseline
    - Standardized Testing Data
      - DeAnn proposed that we set the goal to have a 1% increase in proficiency in English, Science, and Math Aspire Plus. Shauna shared that she felt if this was communicated back to students, it would be a very realistic goal.
    - Peer Observations
      - This year teachers will start by observing within the school and then look to going to other schools next year
      - Goal is for every teacher to do one observation.
  - Review of professional conferences attended and planned for
  - Lorraine shared that she went to the Christy Kane presentation last week, and it was very informative. She brought up that we could look at a mental health/wellness measurement. We want students to be happy too.
    - Facilitator will look to prepare some information on what the school is doing and how we are measuring it.
    - Seth echoed that he feels that is very important too.
- Jessica did the MMHS Highlight on the CTE programs
  - 15 full-time CTE teachers and a few part time teachers
  - Over 50 different CTE classes are offered at MMHS
  - The program is constantly trying to grow in student numbers and class offerings
  - Robyn Dunn is the CTE specialist at MMHS
  - CTE classrooms tend to be specific to the content--like a kitchen, greenhouse, shop, etc.
  - CTE students tend to cover the full spectrum
  - The Governor has made a big push to offer more certifications like a food handler's permit, CPR certification

- One of our seniors this year is a top five candidate for a CTE scholarship
- The program does a CTE month to create more awareness; the classes are electives--so the teachers are constantly fighting to keep their programs moving forward.
- Many of the classes are associated with a career club (CTSOs)
  - These clubs also give students great opportunities to develop character, confidence, and citizenship
- CTE offers a lot of opportunities
- CTE practices a department-wide grading scale; they don't include Ds because they want their students to reach higher than a D; raise the bar type of approach
- CTE testing also happens with an end of level test; 80% or above is considered proficient for the state level
- DeAnn shared how much she valued the CTE programs because of the skills developed that add value to life
- Shauna made a motion that the council doesn't meet in December; Jacoy seconded that motion. The council passed the motion.
