

- Potential risk concerns, including student safety, transportation issues, and appropriate supervision.

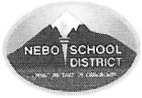


