OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

Seniors, the [Opportunity Scholarship](#) application opens **November 15th**. The **priority deadline is December 2nd**. Counselors encourage you to meet the priority deadline. The regular deadline for the Opportunity Scholarship is February 1st, 2023.

Students need to **request their transcript by November 30th at 2:00 p.m.** To send your transcripts, please fill out the following [form](#). You are responsible for making sure your transcripts are requested by the deadline.

ALL CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT STUDENTS--IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Concurrent enrollment students, please be aware that UVU is introducing a multi-factor authentication method (MFA) for all students logging in to their MyUVU system beginning **Thursday, November 17, 2022**. The two-step process will further ensure that your private data is secure. Concurrent enrollment students who opt-in to MFA can avoid potential challenges with logging in, paying tuition, and even registering for next semester's UVU classes.

Please secure your UVU account with multi-factor authentication (MFA) **before November 16**. Opting in is very easy. IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

When checking out your student, please call ahead (or send a note with your student) to speed up the check-out process. DO NOT leave a message or send an email for immediate check-out. If you cannot get through on our attendance line, please call the main office and someone will assist you (801-794-6740).

When calling the attendance office please listen to both options. Option #1 is for immediate check-out or to speak with Mrs. Bingham, our attendance secretary. Option #2 is to leave Mrs. Bingham a voicemail to excuse your student. (These messages may be left after school hours and can be excused within 5 days of the absence.) You may also excuse your students by emailing her at cami.bingham@nebo.edu.

For immediate check out please call Mrs. Bingham at 801-794-6740 and select option #1. To excuse your student for past or upcoming absences, please leave a voicemail by selecting option #1, then option #2, or you may email Mrs. Bingham at cami.bingham@nebo.edu. You may excuse an absence or tardy **within five days** and will only be able to excuse five tardies per term. Tardies cannot be excused in between class periods or 2nd or 4th period.

Attendance recovery will still be held in the library computer lab. It will take place every day at lunch and Mondays and Wednesdays after school. Students can also arrange attendance recovery options with individual teachers.

If you or your student feels there was a mistake made on their attendance, please have your student talk with the teacher to have it resolved. For example, if they were present or tardy but marked absent by mistake, they would need to clarify that with the teacher who took roll.

ALC STUDENTS


MMHS students who will be attending the ALC need to be aware of the following:

- Students need to be responsible for communicating with their teachers if they need to leave class early to get to their ALC classes, or if they will be arriving late from their ALC classes. MMHS teachers are very willing to work with students on these types of schedules, so please be sure to communicate with them.
- When our school is on an assembly schedule, please remember that the ALC bell and bus schedules **DO NOT change**. They run on their normal schedules every day!!!
- **The bus picks up our ALC students in the bus lane, which is located at the North end of the school. This is a new bus pick-up and drop-off location from last year so please make note of this update.** Please be prompt when meeting the bus!!! They run on a very tight schedule, trying to pick-up high school students throughout the district and transporting them to the ALC building located in Salem, and cannot wait for students who are running late. Students who miss the ALC bus are responsible for working out their own transportation to the ALC – the bus will not return to pick-up late students.
- We have ALC bus and bell schedules in the front office, and they may also be accessed on the ALC website.

Three members of the Maple Mountain High School drill team were chosen to audition for the 5A All-State Drill Team. **Hadlie Miller**, daughter of Haley Miller and the late Jayson Miller; **Lauren Taylor**, daughter of Christopher and Tammy Taylor; and **Oaklee Tingey**, daughter of RaShel Shepherd and Ty Tingey, represented Maple Mountain at the auditions held on Wednesday, November 2

Hadlie is a junior and a second-year member of the Ellevés drill team. She is an assistant drill mistress for the team this year and recently won first place in her category at the Miss Drill Utah solo competition. Hadlie was also a “Top Corp” representative for Maple Mountain at Epic Dance/Drill Camp this past summer.

Lauren is a senior and a third-year member of the Ellevés drill team. She was a costume chairman her junior year and is the Drill Mistress this year. She recently placed 2nd in her category at the Miss Drill Utah solo competition. Lauren was a “Top Corp” representative for Maple Mountain at Epic Dance/Drill Camp this past summer.

Oaklee is a senior and is a second-year member of the Ellevés drill team. She was an assistant drill mistress her junior year and is the president/captain of the team this year. The auditions were held at Hillcrest High School. Each 5A school sent three girls to represent their school for a total of sixty-nine girls who auditioned. A cut was made after the girls showed their technique in an advanced across-the-floor combination in front of a panel of three judges who narrowed it down to forty girls. All three Ellevés made the first cut. Those girls were taught an advanced stylized dance and then auditioned it for the judges, who decided which girls made the team. Twenty-four girls made the final cut, including all three Ellevés, who were named to the 5A All-State Team. The 5A All-State Team will be recognized at the state drill team competition that will be held in February. Congratulations to these girls for their accomplishments!
