SENIORS—SUU SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE EXTENSION

Good news! SUU has extended their scholarship deadline until June 30, 2023.

This means any student who has not applied to SUU can still submit a free application and qualify for an academic scholarship (excludes Presidential Scholarship).

This also means any student who applied after the March 1 deadline will now qualify for a scholarship, and they should have been contacted by our financial aid office.

This is extremely beneficial because students can wait until their Spring Term grades have been posted, and if they qualify for a better scholarship, they can still be awarded the higher scholarship.

HOBY LEADERSHIP CAMP FOR SOPHOMORES

The Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership (HOBY for short) program is a global non-profit focused on building young leaders. It centers on a Social Change Model and prepares students for a lifetime of leadership and service during the seminar. High schools from all over the state of Utah send students, so it's a great way to make lifelong connections to other leaders.

This year our seminar will be from June 14-17th at Wasatch Academy in Mt. Pleasant, Utah. We are able to offer each school limited attendees, so MMHS students will be selected on a first come/first serve basis. There is a fee of \$395 per student. ALC STUDENTS

MMHS students who will be attending the ALC need to be aware of the following:

- Students need to be responsible for communicating with their teachers if they need to leave class
 early to get to their ALC classes, or if they will be arriving late from their ALC classes. MMHS
 teachers are very willing to work with students on these types of schedules, so please be sure to
 communicate with them.
- When our school is on an assembly schedule, please remember that the ALC bell and bus schedule **DO NOT change**. They run on their normal schedules every day!!!
- The bus picks up our ALC students in the bus lane, which is located at the North end of the school. This is a new bus pick-up and drop-off location from last year so please make note of this update. Please be prompt when meeting the bus!!! They run on a very tight schedule, trying to pick-up high school students throughout the district and transporting them to the ALC building located in Salem, and cannot wait for students who are running late. Students who miss the ALC bus are responsible for working out their own transportation to the ALC the bus will not return to pick-up late students.
- We have ALC bus and bell schedules in the front office, and they may also be accessed on the ALC website.

IMPORTANT ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

When checking out your student, please call ahead (or send a note with your student) to speed up the check-out process. DO NOT leave a message or send an email for immediate check-out. If you cannot get through on our attendance line, please call the main office and someone will assist you (801-794-6740).

When calling the attendance office please listen to both options. Option #1 is for immediate check-out or to speak with Mrs. Bingham, our attendance secretary. Option #2 is to leave Mrs. Bingham a voicemail to excuse your student. (These messages may be left after school hours and can be excused within 5 days of the absence.) You may also excuse your students by emailing her at cami.bingham@nebo.edu.


For immediate check out please call Mrs. Bingham at 801-794-6740 and select option #1. To excuse your student for past or upcoming absences, please leave a voicemail by selecting option #1, then option #2, or you may email Mrs. Bingham at cami.bingham@nebo.edu. You may excuse an absence or tardy **within five days** and will only be able to excuse five tardies per term. Tardies cannot be excused in between class periods or 2nd or 4th period.

Attendance recovery will still be held in the library computer lab. It will take place every day at lunch and Mondays and Wednesdays after school. Students can also arrange attendance recovery options with individual teachers.

If you or your student feels there was a mistake made on their attendance, please have your student talk with the teacher to have it resolved. For example, if they were present or tardy but marked absent by mistake, they would need to clarify that with the teacher who took roll.
