*MMHS Artist Visit: On Monday Oct. 19th, our Art Department hosted a Brooklyn-based artist Oliver Herring in the auditorium during A-3 and A-4 classes, as a kind of "in-house field trip. Oliver led a workshop about creativity, showing students how it overlaps with his artistic practice (involving a lot of aluminum foil) with many classes participating. The plan was to introduce and do the work with the foil during the first hour, and then seat the kids in the chairs of the auditorium while Oliver led a "debriefing" session (including Q & A with the students) about the experience during the second hour. Mr. Gillespie has worked with Oliver for four years, and was very excited about this opportunity for our students and our school!

Mr. Gillespie wanted to share some of the publicity that our school received about the collaboration with Oliver Herring last week, as described above. Mr. Gillepie explains: "We ended up going to 5 high schools, as well as UVU & BYU, and then culminating with a huge TASK party at the Mapleton veteran's memorial rec center, where we had 400 people show up and join us for 3 hours!"

Mr. Gillespie has also been talking with the Utah Museum of Contemporary Art (UMOCA), as well as the Springville Museum of Art, about the possibilities of curating this experience in some way to involve more people. He shared that: "Steve Olpin, a local freelance videographer, followed our group around most of the time, and we're going to explore the possibility of turning this footage into something that focuses specifically on students and learning. Mostly I just wanted to thank all of you for your support for this seemingly crazy time! Oliver said that he was blown away by Utah, and that we totally exceeded his expectations, and he thinks this could really have legs for education."

- Helping you prepare for IEP meetings and providing support during IEP meetings.
- Connecting you to resources and supports in your community.
- Providing information about upcoming events in the district and statewide.
