**\*PSAT Test:** The PSAT will be administered at MMHS on Wednesday, October 15, 2014. The PSAT serves as a practice test for the SAT as well as the qualifying test for the National Merit Scholarship. Sophomores and Juniors may take the test. In order to be considered for the National Merit Scholarship, the PSAT must be taken during the Junior year. Register in the Finance Office, the regular cost of the test is \$20. Students may register for a guaranteed seat at a discounted rate of \$15, on or before September 26. Registration will continue on September 29 on a first come first served basis at the \$20 rate. See your Counselor if you have questions or would like more information about the benefits of taking PSAT.
