MMHS Boys' Tennis: "The varsity boys tennis team travelled to St. George last weekend to play against some of the best 3A, 4A, and 5A tennis programs in the state. Twelve teams gathered at the Tonaquint Tennis Center to compete in the Stephen Wade Invitational Tournament for two days of pre-season competition. By the end of the first day, the team stood undefeated at every position with tenacious victories over Northridge, Layton and Desert Hills. The Friday victories placed the team in the top bracket against the best players of all twelve schools. Austin Edwards and Eli Brady took third place at the number one doubles position with a come from behind victory against Orem. Peyton Lewis and Peter Fuksa finished second with a win over Orem's second doubles team. All three of our single players were undefeated to take championship positions against difficult opponents. Brigham Perry took first at number three singles, Eric Whiting the champion at number 2 singles and Daniel Blonquist at the number 1 spot with come from behind victories over Bonneville and Orem. Maple Mountain has brought home the trophy for the last three years running. Congratulations to the varsity tennis team!"
