Golden Eagle Students and Parents!

I'm excited to welcome you to the new school year. We are living in an exciting and ever-changing time, but I know that we can handle whatever comes our way! In this letter, you will find a ton of information. I encourage you to take a few minutes to look it over.

Students will be given the choice between two different options for returning to school in the fall:

At-School Learning

- All students receive instruction at the school every day – full time.
- Parents perform daily wellness checks of each student before school attendance.
- Physical/social distancing will be implemented where possible.
- Students and employees wear face masks when social distancing is not possible.
- Bus students must wear face masks and will have assigned seating.
- Enhanced sanitizing practices and routines will be implemented.
- IEP and 504 plans will be met.

Remote Learning

- Students will be assigned a Nebo Remote Learning teacher.
 - **Offered through Utah Students Connect for high school students. NO pass/fail grades. Registration will be through our counseling department after Aug 3.*
- Primary instruction will be focused on reading, writing, mathematics, and science; with supplemental support in other curricular areas.
- IEP and 504 plans will be met.
- Those who choose Remote Learning will need to stay with that option for the first term/quarter of the year.

In a previous email, I mentioned that MMHS will be going to a One-to-One Technology model. Students will be provided a Chromebook to use at school and at home for the entire school year. There will be no charge for this, but students will be responsible for any damages that might happen to their assigned device. We highly encourage you to purchase the \$30 protection plan that will cover unforeseeable damages. You can pay during online registration, and you'll also find an attached information sheet with this email.

School will begin on August 19, 2020. We will start promptly at 7:50 a.m. and finish at 2:25 p.m. Mondays will be teacher collaboration days (7:50 a.m. to 1:40 p.m.). Our normal schedule will be from 7:50 a.m. to 2:25 p.m. (T-W-Th-F).

Instructions for Registering Your Student

The district has moved from ASPIRE to the Infinite Campus student information system. All registration will now take place on I-Campus. You should have received an email on July 13 to give you electronic access. The email has the title: "Nebo-InfiniteCampus." If you can't find it, check your SPAM folder or go to <http://www.nebo.edu/registration>.

Class Schedule Adjustments

The switch to I-Campus does not allow students to change their schedules online. Because of this, class changes will be very difficult to do and will only be available under certain circumstances.

- Students need to complete the registration process and pay their fees before they are able to apply for a class change.
- Students will be able to access their schedule starting August 3. **Please consider emailing your counselor with your questions versus coming into the office to maintain social distancing.**
- To comply with health regulations, we will **NOT** have students or parents line up in the Counseling Center to change schedules or meet with a counselor.
 - August 3 - August 20: There will be a Class Change Google Form on the [MMHS Counseling Website](#) for students to request a change in their schedule.
 - August 21: There will be a \$10.00 fee to change schedules and it must still be done through the Google Form.
 - **August 26: There will be no class changes after this date.**
- Many students will find gaps in their schedules that need to be filled. Students can fill those gaps by submitting the same Class Change Google Form to indicate which class(es) they would like to add.
- Students who indicated **Remote Learning** during Registration must fill out the Remote Learning Google Form to specify which five classes they're enrolling for. [Utah Students Connect Course Offerings](#)

- Counselors will be meeting with senior students and their parents for their College and Career Readiness Plan starting the last week of July. Seniors have been sent a link to their student email account to sign up for a time slot. Please make sure students select the correct counselor based on the student's last name.
- For the remainder of the summer, a counselor will be available on Mondays from 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. for questions regarding online options. **Counselors will not be making any schedule changes until August 3.** Email contacts are listed below based on the student's last name.

Dress Code

In the coming weeks, many students will be shopping for school clothes. In order to minimize misunderstandings regarding dress code, please be aware of the following school and district policy which is in place to help ALL students have a successful and safe school experience.

Clothing must be modest. Modesty includes covering shoulders, midriff, back, underwear, and cleavage. Inappropriately short, tight, or revealing clothing is prohibited. Skirts, dresses, and shorts must be at least mid-thigh length when the student is sitting.

Clothing and personal items such as jewelry, backpacks, fanny packs, gym bags, water bottles, etc., shall be free of writing, pictures, or any other insignias that are lewd, obscene, vulgar, or profane; are violent or advocate hate; signify gang affiliation; promote or represent tobacco, alcohol, drugs, or illegal substances; promote or represent criminal or illegal activities; infringe upon the rights of others, or are sexually suggestive.

Fees

All fees can be paid online through myschoolfees.com. You are still able to pay in person at the school, but we encourage online payment to minimize traffic in the school building where possible.

Fee Waivers

School administration will be available to meet for fee waivers on July 28 and 29 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the main school office. Annual renewals are mandatory. No appointment necessary, but please wear a mask. To qualify for a fee waiver, you must meet ONE of the following guidelines:

1. Family receives TANF/FEP (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families or Family Employment Program) (financial assistance or food stamps)
 - Must provide verification from the Utah Department of Workforce Services (electronic is acceptable)
2. Student receives Supplemental Security Income (SSI, Qualified Child with Disabilities)
 - Must provide verification from the Social Security Administration
3. Student is in Foster Care (under Utah or local government supervision)
 - Must provide Youth in Care Intake Form and school enrollment letter
4. Student is in State Custody
 - Must provide Youth in Care Intake Form and school enrollment letter
5. Student is eligible based on family/household income verification.
 - Must provide pay stub, or tax return (complete Pg 2 of application)
